DELSEA ENERGY SUBMITS PORT AUTHORITY REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

TOMS RIVER, NJ - In support of the State of New Jersey's renewable energy efforts and in conjunction with their own quest for renewable energy and environmental resourcefulness, the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey has received a reply from Delsea Energy, LLC. This Request for Information ("RFI") could provide a newer, cleaner source of electricity as the State of New Jersey seeks to develop 200 megawatts of wind energy by 2020, while augmenting an active port and generating enough wind energy to power more than 2,000 homes in the area.

The RFI seeks responses from firms with experience in developing wind generation projects. Information received will be used to support the development of a contract for a future wind energy development project within the Port District. The final contract will designate the Port Authority as a strategic partner that will provide high-value land with a measured, viable wind resource; conduct certain pre-construction studies; address many permitting requirements; and seek a qualified wind energy developer to finance, construct, operate and maintain the project. This RFI also requests that respondents provide an assessment of market interest, analysis regarding the proposed project structure, timeline, and any additional information in support of regional wind energy development.
